'Bloated bureaucracy leaves NHS unfit for purpose'

It's hard to know where to start when it comes to measuring performance in the NHS. Knowing how many staff are employed might be a good start but the fact that we do not have precise figures for that is scandal enough given the scale of the NHS budget.

Part 1 attempts to establish the total numbers employed in the NHS.

Part 2 reveals the huge rise in the number of non-patientfacing staff recruited in the past three years alone.

We are also indebted to Martin Daubney and the GB News team for providing us with the opportunity to discuss these figures on air with him last week.




