Latest official figures show yet again that the UK dodged a bullet


CIBUK summarises the bad news for those who want to rejoin the EU

On Thursday the data from the EU's official statistics agency revealed the Eurozone as a whole has fallen into recession. This is the technical definition when an economy contracts for two consecutive quarters, which is what the Eurozone has now done.


