The Swiss say no to the ECHR's ruling against them last week, as Martin Daubney explains

Once again we must stress that this ECHR ruling about climate change against Switzerland affects the UK which will now be subject to claims for damages. This arises because the UK still follows ECHR case law, no matter how dubious the grounds for their judgements might be, nor by how much they are extending their remit so far beyond what was envisaged in the original treaty last century.

Summary

The threats to the Swiss way of life from the EU and others, as Pro Schweiz sees them

- "Serious efforts by the country's political elite to surrender our independence and align ourself with centralized supra-organizations like the EU and NATO
- "The strong centralist tendencies of international organizations wanting to bring countries around the world into line with each other
- "Ever-increasing efforts by a small domestic minority to erode the freedoms of our citizens and to indoctrinate and dictate to them"

The organisation goes on to say:

- "Pro Switzerland wants to put a stop to this! Pro Switzerland respects Swiss tradition. Pro Switzerland is not politically affiliated. It is not interested in ideologies and party political bickering, but purely and simply in the best solutions for our country and our people, for freedom, peace, independence, safety and prosperity.
- "Pro Switzerland wants to create framework conditions and opportunities for young people in particular to thrive."

Switzerland's neutrality and NATO

Many British and international readers will identify with the concerns of Pro Swizerland and the Swiss people.

The only area of difference for British readers may be the principle of the centuries-old tradition of Swiss neutrality, which means they will not join NATO. Now that previously-neutral Sweden has joined NATO, we believe there is value in one European country maintaining its neutrality. This is not always seen by the public but it has great diplomatic value in times of conflict, as a place where antogonists can negotiate peace on neutral soil.
