'Who will unblock our political system?'

Frustration at the state of the country and the way we are governed is reflected in the following short article by Michael Wood, former businessman and contributing author at the Bruges Group.

Writing of his despair and disgust at the current political status quo he reflects the views of millions who are genuinely unsure who to vote for at the next general election, so utterly discredited are the three main parties in Parliament.

It is time, he feels to look at those outside parties, Reform on the right and the SDP on the centre-left for the real choice on offer to the British people.

But can they break through in the way that so many wish them to, or will they be suffocated by the larger parties through the first-past-the-post electoral system?

Whatever the outcome of the forthcoming general election, it will be fascinating to see the extent to which the electorate as a whole turns their back on the current status quo.

The government is constipated

The conservative party is constipated. Bringing back Cameron makes it worse, not better. The One Nation group of MPs led by Damien Green is Europhile. Despite the failing performance of the EU's major economies, they still worship the 'project'. It's hard not to believe that their shenanigans are not deliberate sabotage. They have no hope of rejoining the EU unless Labour come to power. Like fifth columns throughout

history, they have been hiding in plain sight, waiting for the right time. Immigration is not the real issue, but a convenient means of hiding real intention with faux liberalism.

Immigration cannot be solved by offshoring. It can be solved by removing the possibility of cheap foreign labour, training British people, investing in ways to improve productivity.
