The future's bright – the future's the UK

The world's young people give massive vote of confidence in Brexit Britain



Who said the EU was the future?

Attempts by the EU commission to 'woo the young vote' have fallen on stony ground as the UK continues to attract rising numbers of both international and European students.

CIBUK (https://cibuk.org/) – the longest-established organisation for independence, freedom and democracy in the UK – highlights the UK's enduring appeal as the destination of choice for European and international students. The summary is below and the full report is now available here.

So much for the malign effects of Brexit on international student numbers: in 2020/21, the numbers coming to Britain to study **exceeded 600,000 for the first time ever:**

Total international students studying in the UK - 2016-2021 Latest official figures for academic year 2020/21



The UK is twice as popular as the EU

- The 2020/21 total for all first-year students at UK universities was 36% of total student numbers.
- 64,300 were from the EU and 254,100 from outside the EU.
- In the last 10 years the numbers of new students from Italy and Spain increased by 41% and 62% respectively.
- In 2019, the UK took 12% of the world's international students. This was more than double the EU average.
- According to the latest numbers for 2020/21 for the top 10 most common countries
 from which the UK's international students have come since 2016, five EU
 countries are on the list. These are Italy, France, Romania, Poland and Portugal.

Academic staff numbers from the EU have also increased since 2016:

- In 2019/20, there were 70,195 academic staff from overseas at UK universities.
- This was 31% of all academic staff and 20% more than in 2015/16.
- 38,410 were from the EU and 31,785 from other countries
- In other words more than half are from the EU.

OBSERVATIONS

So much for leaving a sinking vessel. Britain, it appears, is more popular than ever as a destination for international students and academics, increasing by more than a third since we voted to leave the European Union.
