

Shock UK sign-up as Government joins EU defence programme

As we commemorate Armistice Day, UK binds itself to EU's Common Defence Policy



- The UK government commits Britain to one of the European Union's most important defence projects – 'PESCO'
- This is the "Permanent Structured Cooperation" on Defence

In Brussels on Thursday the EU was jubilant:
