Northern Ireland

- The most egregious example of EU intransigence applies to the province of Northern Ireland which remains subject to any new laws and regulations the EU decides to impose.
- These are laws over which these British citizens have no say. These citizens of part
 of the UK can't vote out the foreign body which is imposing these laws. Their
 judiciary has no say they must obey the diktats of a foreign power.

Commenting, CIBUK's Communications Director Ben Philips said:

"Thanks to the iniquities of the Northern Ireland Protocol, a sovereign part of the United Kingdom remains hostage to the arbitrary jurisdiction of the EU. It is quite clear to every objective and impartial observer that the measures being demanded by the EU in relation to Northern Ireland are wholly unreasonable and would never be countenanced in dealings between two sovereign states. This is vassalage pure and simple."
